

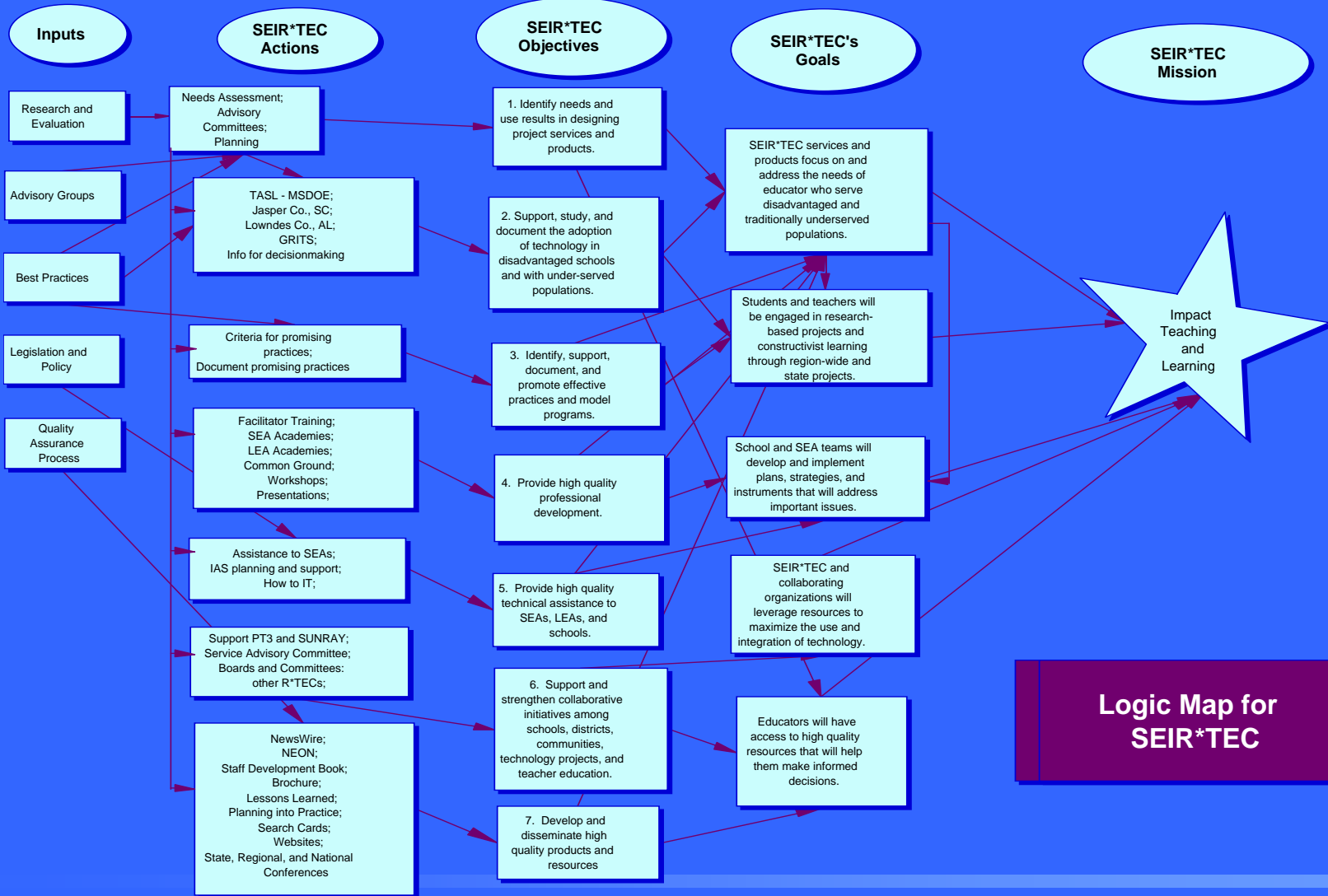

What is a logic map?

A logic map is a graphic representation of the relationships among the forces that shape a program or project and facilitate (or inhibit) its success.

What are the basic elements of a logic map?

Outcomes, Impacts, or Goals:

What difference will the project or program make in the long run?

What impact will it have on learners?

Basic Elements . . .

Objectives, Intermediate Outcomes, or Short Term Goals:

Objectives, intermediate outcomes, and short term goals must be measurable.

They should result from the program's activities, and they should lead to the achievement of the program's long term goals or outcomes.

Basic Elements . . .

Activities, Actions, Strategies, or Tasks:

What is the program going to do?

What are the major programmatic activities?

Who are the intended audiences or participants?

Basic Elements . . .

Inputs, Contexts or Conditions:

What things must be considered when planning programmatic activities?
